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THAILAND Formalities before departure

A passport is required to enter Thailand. It must be valid for at least six months beyond the date of entry into the country.

No visa is required, provided that the duration of stay does not exceed 30 days and that entry and exit are by air.

These conditions may be questioned at any time by the immigration services. In order to avoid unpleasant surprises, it is prudent to consult the website of the Thai embassy in your country, which keeps up to date in real time the latest developments in terms of formalities.

There are no airport taxes to pay on arrival or departure from Thailand.

No vaccinations are required to stay in the country.

The driving licence is part of the official documents to take with you. Even if you only rent scooters, the provider or the police may ask you for it. It is not systematic far from there, but know that the theory is the following: to use a scooter, you must have a driving licence and at least fifteen years old. If you don't have your licence with you, you pay a fine of 500 thb and they let you leave with a smile.

It's worth getting an international driving licence before you leave. The formalities are free of charge. When renting a scooter or in case of trouble with the police, you might as well leave a worthless document rather than your passport or real driving licence.

Finally, here's a common precaution every time you travel abroad: scan all your official documents and forward them by e-mail to your own e-mail address so that you have copies in case of loss or theft:

Documents to be saved

- Passport
- Identity card
- National and international driving licence
- Family Booklet
- Vaccination record
- Plane ticket
- Bank stop number, insurance emergency number



ABOUT YOUR HEALTH

Compulsory and recommended vaccinations

The Thai health authorities do not impose mandatory vaccinations, however it is recommended to be up-to-date with basic vaccinations, including typhoid and hepatitis A. If your stay is off the beaten track, it is necessary to check with a doctor specializing in tropical diseases who will adjust the protection to your course.

Is it necessary to take a treatment against malaria?

Malaria is not very present in the country. Except for the forest areas bordering the North with Laos and Myanmar, the other regions are free of the disease. In the evening, when flying, the best protection is to cover your arms and legs and spray the remaining exposed areas with insect screen spray. Mosquitoes that fly at night are the only vectors of malaria. They are most active at sunset (this is the time of the flight). Mosquitoes that fly during the day carry dengue fever. In case your trip takes you to remote areas such as the Golden Triangle, with nights in the villages, then it is also advisable to consult a doctor of tropical diseases who will prescribe you an appropriate treatment if necessary.

Potability of water

Tap water is unfit for consumption. To avoid any risk of contamination, care should be taken to drink only water sold in sealed bottles. You can find it absolutely everywhere, at any time of the day or night, in tourist sites, markets, small supermarkets often open 24 hours a day.



KOH SAMUI

How to get Here

White sand beaches, clear waters, lush tropical forest, and fresh coconut water are only a few of the things you will find in the beautiful island of Koh Samui. Located on the Gulf of Thailand, this holiday destination has everything a traveler could hope for an unforgettable beach holiday. But before enjoying the sunny days and warm sea, you must discover how to get to Koh Samui and plan the best route for your trip.

Compared to the other islands in Thailand, getting to Koh Samui is reasonably easy. Koh Samui Airport is well connected, receiving national and international flights. You can also travel to Koh Samui by ferry or a combination of bus/train + ferry, it all depends on where in Thailand you are traveling from.

HOW TO GET TO KOH SAMUI FROM BANGKOK

There are a couple of options to travel from Bangkok to Koh Samui, ranging from being super-quick to long and scenic. You can fly from Bangkok to Koh Samui or travel by a combination of bus/train plus ferry. It all depends on your time, budget, and style of travel.

The most efficient way to travel from Bangkok to Koh Samui is by flight. There are an average of twenty daily flights to Koh Samui between 6:00 AM – 8:30 PM. The journey from Suvarnabhumi Airport to Koh Samui Airport takes 75 – 90 minutes. The fast journey comes with a higher price tag, flying to Koh Samui is usually the most expensive way to get to the island.

If the direct flights from Bangkok to Koh Samui are too costly but you don't want to spend 15 – 17 hours on the road, you can buy flight + bus + ferry tickets. Nok Air, Air Asia, and Thai Lion Air offer combo tickets, departing from Don Muang Airport at regular intervals between 6:00 AM and 10:30 AM. Journey length ranges about 6 hours, and you will be dropped off at Koh Samui pier.

GETTING TO AND AROUND KOH SAMUI BY FERRY

Arriving at one of Samui's ferry piers offer a pleasant alternative to the airport to get to the island. If you travel by car around southern Thailand, you can get to Samui by ferry which offers an economical way to get there. Travelling by ferry to Samui from the main pier on the mainland - Donsak - takes roughly two hours. The cruise is usually tranquil, and has a strong holiday feel. The island of Samui has four ferry piers. Each of them has different connections to the continent and to the largest islands close to Samui; namely, Koh Phangan and Koh Tao. Nathon is the main port of arrival and departure by ferry in Samui. Lipa Noi Pier is of a smaller size and is connected to Donsak Pier, just south of Suratthani on the continent. Bangrak Pier is situated to the northwest of Samui, and is the main port connected to Koh Phangan and Koh Tao. Last but not least, Maenam Pier has ferries to get to the two islands forementioned, and to Suratthani.



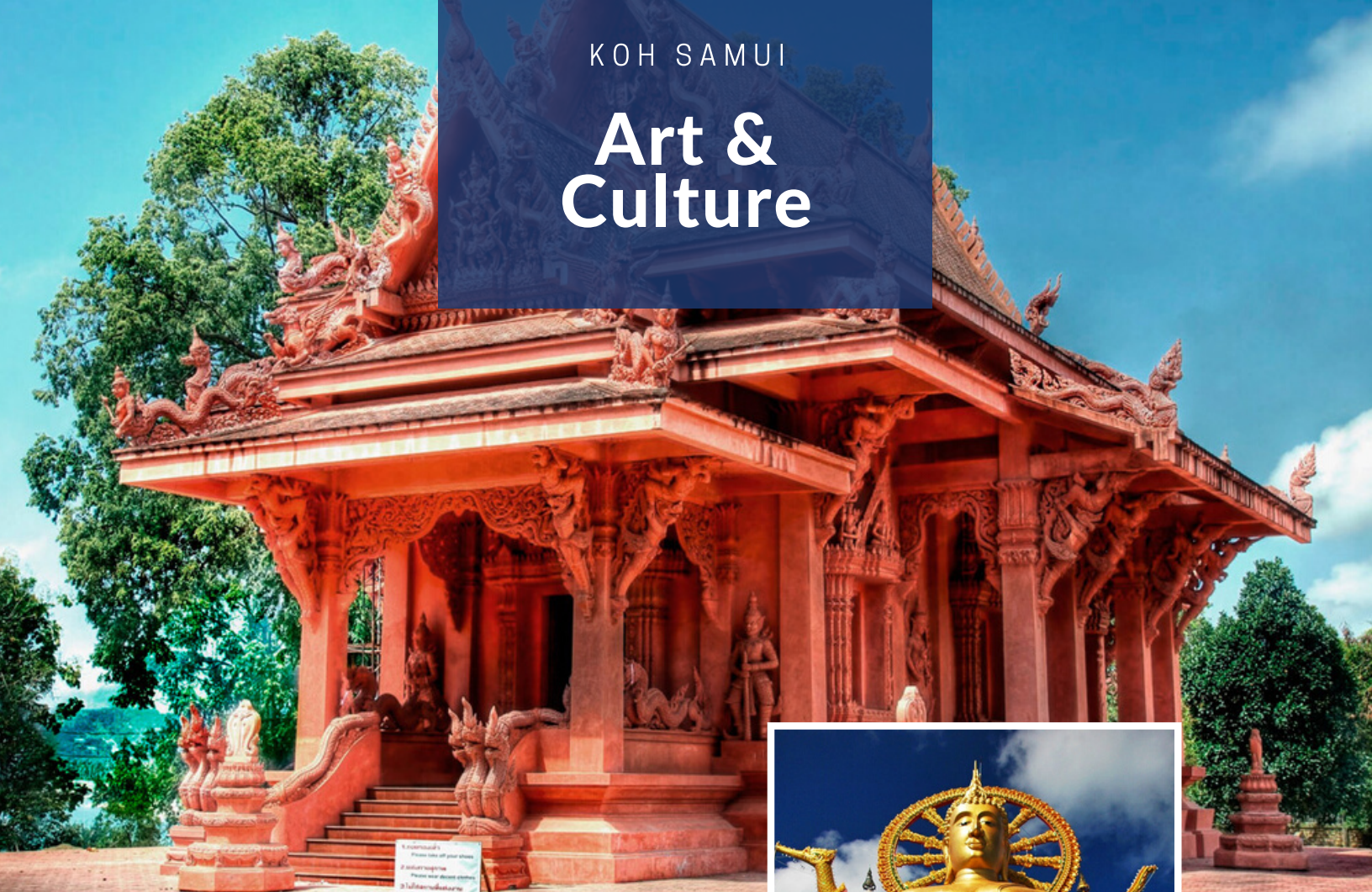

Art & Culture



At Eranda Villa, you can choose between the pleasures of a peaceful relaxation holiday or the contemplation of wide ranging cultural places... It is thought that Koh Samui was first inhabited around 1,500 years ago by fishermen from the Malay Peninsula and southern coast of China. The island is referenced on ancient Chinese maps, which date back to 1687, as 'Pulo Cornam'. The word 'Samui' may be an extension of the name of a native tree, Mui, or may possibly originate from the Chinese word 'saboei' which means 'safe haven'. Little was known about the island until the first boat transportation service to Koh Samui was launched in the mid-1800s. Back then it took a full day of sailing to cover the 35 km voyage from Suratthani on the mainland. Until tourism came to Koh Samui, the island was an isolated community, with little contact to the mainland. Before the island's first roads were built in the 1970s, the journey from the east to west coast was a 15 kilometer trek through the island central belt of mountainous jungle. Since this time, Samui has grown and developed exponentially to become the successful SE Asian tropical, tourist destination that it is today. Koh Samui currently has an estimated population of 63000 people with a strong economy that depends on a successful tourist industry as well as the exporting of coconut and rubber.

BIG BUDDHA

Big Buddha temple sits majestically on a small rocky island off Koh Samui's north-eastern corner. Known locally as Wat Phra Yai, its golden, 12-metre seated Buddha statue was built in 1972 and remains one of the island's most popular attractions. Set on Koh Faan, Big Buddha temple is reached by a causeway that connects it to the main island. The Big Buddha can be seen at a distance of several kilometres and is often the first landmark people see when arriving to Samui by air.



WAT PLAI LAEM

Chinese Thai Beliefs

Wat Plai Laem is a Buddhist temple compound on Samui's north-east coast of Samui, featuring a striking white 18-arm image of Guanyin, the Goddess of Mercy and Compassion. Close to the Big Buddha temple, Wat Plai Laem offers visitors a view into Chinese-Thai beliefs as well as some elaborate Buddhist-themed art and architecture.

WAT KHUNARAM

The mummified monk

Koh Samui's Mummified Monk at Wat Khunaram is an unusual sight yet it offers a unique insight into Buddhist and Thai culture. The monk Luong Pordaeng died in 1973 in a seated meditative position, and ever since his body has been on display in an upright glass case at the temple. Remarkably, even more than 30 years on the monk's body shows little sign of decay. For some visitors, having a dead man in full view might be a shocking sight, but for Thais it is something to reflect upon and revere.

WAT KHAO CHEDI

Reclining Buddha

The Pagoda Khao Chedi is a Srivijaya-style chedi situated on a hill above the Laem Sor. It, also, goes by the name Laem Sor Pagoda, which can be a bit confusing seeing as there is another Laem Sor Pagoda below it on Bang Kao Beach, but this one's golden. You get spectacular views from this vantage point including mainland Suratthani, Bang Kao Bay all the way to Laem Set Point and Koh Tao and Koh Mud Sum in addition to Wat Laem Sor.

WAT SILA NGU

Stone snake Temple

Wat Sila Ngu (aka Wat Ratcha Thammaram) is a Buddhist temple located along the Ring Road, near Lamai. Sila Ngu translates into 'stone snake' in English, and you can see many stone-carved snakes all around the compound. This long-established temple may look standard and slightly run-down at first sight, but it has recently been upgraded with the addition of a magnificent large new building realised in deep red clay. This building adds to the mysterious yet serene atmosphere of the temple as the large room it houses is pretty sombre and its walls are entirely carved with scenes of the Buddha's life. The seaside location of this temple also permits splendid views to Samui's east coast.

TRADITIONAL FISHING

A journey through time

Thailand needs no introduction as one of the world most exotic and tropical holiday destinations and in recent years has become increasingly popular with visiting anglers in search of monster freshwater fish. Thailand offers angling for some of the largest freshwater fish in the world, all native to Thailand and attain world record breaking size. Whether you wish to sample the amazing wild freshwater fishing Thailand has to offer, or want to visit a heavily stocked commercial fishery in search of that fish of a lifetime, let our team guide you on your fishing adventures in Koh Samui.

THE BIRDSHOWS

Natural music

You have surely seen them in the traffic. Men precariously steering scooters with one hand, while carrying a covered birdcage in the other hand. Inside the cage is a prized possession – a Red-whiskered Bulbul, used in the traditional bird-singing competitions of southern Thailand. On Samui, the competitions are held every Tuesday and Saturday at 11:00 am. It is not advertised, there is nothing touristy about it, and if you don't know where it is, you will not find it. The location for the competition is down what is known locally as the 'Ghost Road' – the road that links Bangrak to Chaweng.

TRADITIONAL DANCE

Pure grace

The main dramatic art form of Thailand. Thai dance, like many forms of traditional Asian dance, can be divided into two major categories that correspond roughly to the high art (classical dance) and low art (folk dance) distinction. Although the traditional Thai performing arts are not as vibrant as they once were, suffering inroads from Western entertainment and generally changing tastes, Thai dance drama is not extinct. What survives displays the elegance of an art form refined over centuries. Aside from folk and regional dances (southern Thailand's Indian-influenced manohra dance, for example), the two major forms of Thai classical dance drama are khon and lakon nai. In the beginning, both were exclusively court entertainments and it was not until much later that a popular style of Dance Theater, likay, evolved as a diversion for common folk who had no access to royal performances.



THAI BOXING

The spirit of the warrior

Muay Thai or Thai boxing is the cultural martial art of Thailand. The origin of Muay Thai dates back several hundred years, and was, essentially, developed as a form of close-combat that used the entire body as a weapon. It is established around the world as a fitness form (Muay aerobic), as a ring sport (Muay Thai) and as a form of self-defense (Muay Boran). MUAYTHAI includes many aspects yet stands as a singular sport with a proud tradition and heritage, a long lasting culture, with people practicing the sport for fitness, health, self-confidence, and an over-all way of life!

RECEPTION OPENING HOURS

The reception is open seven days a week from 08.00 to 21.00

Check-in time : from 14:00 Check-out time : before 12:00 (Noon)
Earlier check-ins and Late check-outs are free of charge but subject to availability.

For early check-outs, we can check the villa and prepare your bill the night before you leave. Please contact the reception team the day before to arrange an appointment between 19.00 and 21.00.

TRANSFERS TO/FROM THE AIRPORT

Transfer Services to/from the airport are available and free of charge. To organize your check-out transfer properly, please contact the reception during your stay. Transfer details must be given at least 24 hours before departure.

INTERNET & WIFI

Free WIFI connections are available in your villa and throughout the property. Username & Password will be given to you at Check In.

HOUSEKEEPING

Your villa will be cleaned every day. If you wish not to be disturbed, please display the sign next to the door.

Bed sheets will be changed every 3 days. Bathroom and Pool towels are changed everyday. Garbage will be picked up daily by our housekeeping team.

For environmental purposes, you will find 2 garbage bins under the kitchen sink. One for plastic bottles and aluminium cans, the second one for general waste.

LAUNDRY SERVICE

A laundry service is available. You will find a laundry bag in the wardrobes. Please fill in the form, put it in the bag and drop it at the reception during operating hours. We will bring it back to you within 24 hours. Rate: per piece.

ELECTRICITY & WATER CONSUMPTIONS

For daily and weekly rentals, Electricity & Water consumptions are included in the rental price. Electricity in Thailand is 220 V / 50 cycles. If needed, plug adapters are available at the reception. In case of power cut, a flashlight is available in each bedroom of the villa.

SMOKING

Eranda Villa is a Non-Smoking Property. Smoking is only permitted outside and cigarette butts should be disposed in the ashtrays meant for that purpose.

NO ANIMALS & PETS

Pets are not allowed in the property.

SWIMMING POOL

The pool is private and to be used for the number of people authorized in the villa. For your own safety, it is strictly forbidden to jump or dive into the swimming pool. The management will take no responsibility for any accident resulting of such behavior. If kids may play around the swimming pools, kindly take the necessary precautions.

FIREWORKS & BARBECUES

Not allowed in the premises. Any evidence of transgression may result in immediate eviction with no refund.

NO NOISE & PARTY POLICY

As the villas are located in a Spa where serenity & calm is observed, guests are required not to cause any noise-nuisance or disturbance in the premises. Kindly keep the volume of the TV and music down enough not to disturb your neighbors.

No parties, loud disturbances are allowed or tolerated in the premises. In the event of a disturbance, one polite request (warning) will be given to reduce the noise. If our request is not followed, the guest will be asked to leave the villa without refund.

Kindly respect your neighbors to have a cool stay without being disturbed yourself .
